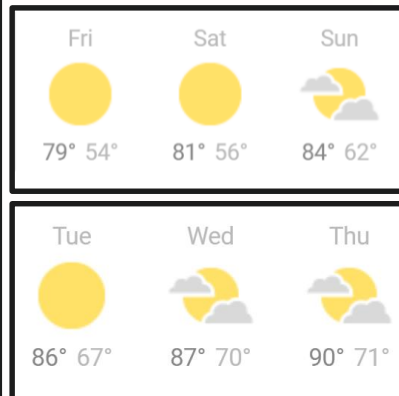

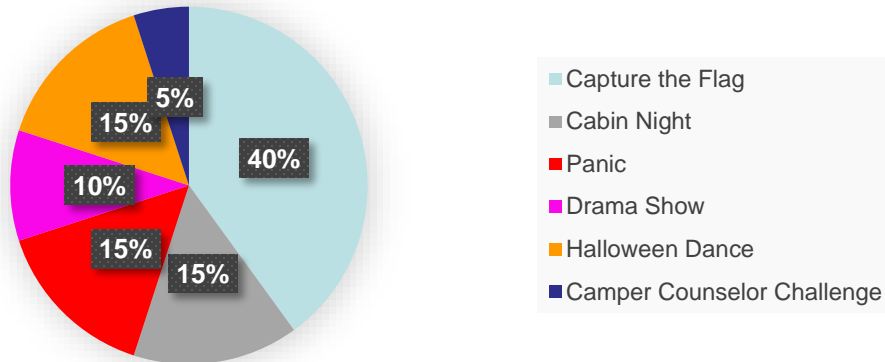

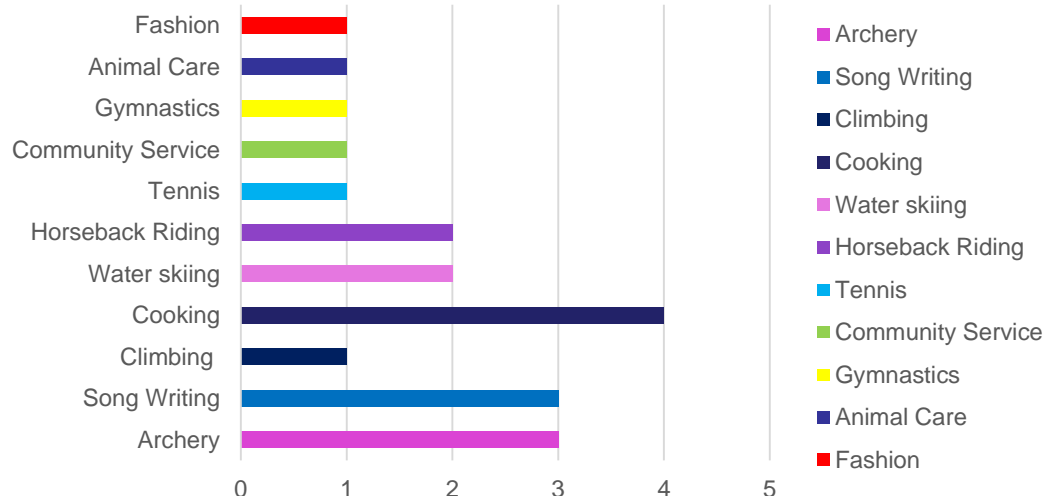
Favorite Evening Activity
