


ALUMNI NEWSLETTER

Dear Camp Alumni,

As the weather warmed this past spring, we found ourselves immersed in camp preparations. We had celebrated our 85th summer in 2019, and we were eager to get back to camp for our 86th. The program calendar was set, camp brothers and sisters were assigned, activity selection forms were mailed, and New Camper Parties were around the corner. We were ready... and then our world drastically changed.

COVID-19 forced camp professionals to face difficult decisions they never thought they would have to make. Should we open camp? Could we open camp? Would it be possible to keep the integrity of our programs and traditions while keeping campers and staff safe? Would it feel like camp without hugs and



singing around the campfire? Lake of the Woods and Greenwoods ran consecutively for 85 summers; would that come to a halt in 2020? Our campers had activities, events, and celebrations canceled. Would we have to add to that growing list of disappointments that they were facing?

We knew that camp wouldn't necessarily look the same, but if allowed to open safely, we committed to do anything and everything possible to make camp FEEL the same.

We also knew that with borders and embassies closed, we would not be able to greet our staff who come to us every summer from all over the world. We would miss the accents, the singing of anthems on International Day, and the lessons and culture brought to our little town in Decatur; such a cherished part of the camp experience.

As the summer inched closer, we did not see a clear path to open our summer session in time for 1st session. It was heartbreaking, but we had to cancel all of our 1st session programs, and both sessions of The Grove, our two-week program for boys. We wanted more time to see if the 2nd session was a possibility. Our patience paid off.

I will never forget getting that phone call on June 12th, the call to notify us that the State of Michigan had given us the green light to open for the 2nd session. We had a little over a month until Opening Day, and from that day on we spent every minute of every day evaluating and redesigning every aspect of camp operations. Every little detail was explored, down to the way we served parmesan cheese for pasta at dinner!



Our campers arrived on July 20th. As anticipated, camp did look different. Campers were assigned specific arrival times, and to either drive or take the bus to camp. Our elective program shifted to activity zones with scheduled times for cabin groups. Greenwoods campers ate meals outside under a large wedding tent. There was testing, both before and during camp. Campers and staff wore masks when they were with anyone outside of their cabin group. This list of adaptations we made was endless.

But for all that was different, so much was the same. New friendships were formed, skills were learned, and independence was gained. We learned to see the smiles behind the masks, and there were SO many smiles. It was still camp, and nothing took away from that feeling and energy created there each summer. All of us, campers and staff included, grew a new appreciation and gratitude for our home away from home at Lake of the Woods and Greenwoods.

Did opening camp come without risk? Absolutely not. Was the risk worth it? ABSOLUTELY! The four weeks that we had at camp in 2020 were nothing short of magical! It was incredible that we had the opportunity to provide a safe, fun, and much-needed experience for many campers.

We heard daily from campers, parents, and you, our alumni. You checked in on us, gave us encouragement, and reminded us how important this "home away from home" was to you - for some even decades later. We want to thank you for your support. It wasn't always easy, but your enthusiasm for camp and motivation helped us to push forward and devise a plan to open safely this past summer.

While we hope that the world is in a different place by summer 2021, we are confident that our **COVID Safety Plan** can be implemented once again with any necessary adaptations needed.

We look forward to future summers where we can invite our alumni to once again gather with us at camp, tell stories around the campfire, sing songs loudly and likely off-key, and share in the camp magic and traditions they helped create.
